Their money could be used to pay a salary of a professional fundraiser/ administrative assistant to organize the fundraising and community interest to support a theatre.</p>	
<p>7. Principal’s Report</p> <p>Field trips Field trips finish at the end of May. There are two trips going in June; life skills and futures students are going to an arts workshop. The transition students are going to a dragon boat race.</p> <p>Staffing John is still working on staffing. He needs to hire 2 or 3 more teachers. Because Jim Nobel is retiring, we have been assigned a new vice principal. Our new vice principal will be Claire Ailey, who is currently at Bateman.</p> <p>Accomplishments Sports teams are all doing well. Our students did well in the math contest. The grade 9s won the Haltons. Our cheerleaders are National Champions. Maida H. in grade 11 is going to OFSAA for single tennis, and a grade 11 student is going to OFSAA for track. Maida H. is also going to Washington DC. for a leadership conference. The awards ceremony is on Monday at an assembly. There are a lot of students running for student council. There are 26 students running for 7 offices. Elections are Monday morning after the Carnival.</p> <p>Smoking We have a new smoking by law officer, who is more of a “by the book” officer. She has indicated she will not allow the school to ignore the students who smoke by the rocks. The September assembly will have announcements that students are now allowed to smoke by the rocks, on school property.</p> <p>Other Brian Henderson from Fast Signs has found a company that will manufacture a digital sign that will fit between the current posts.
